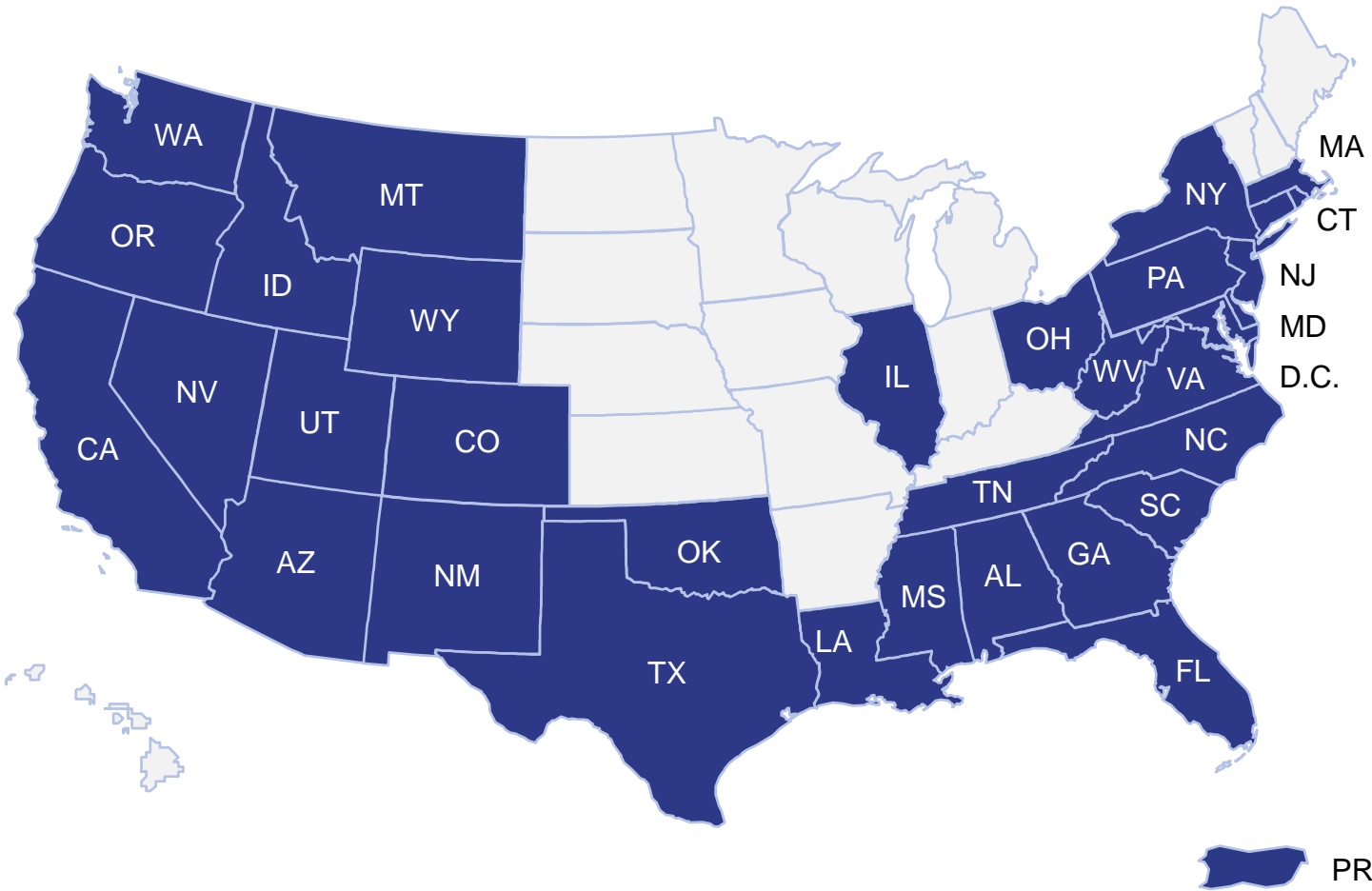

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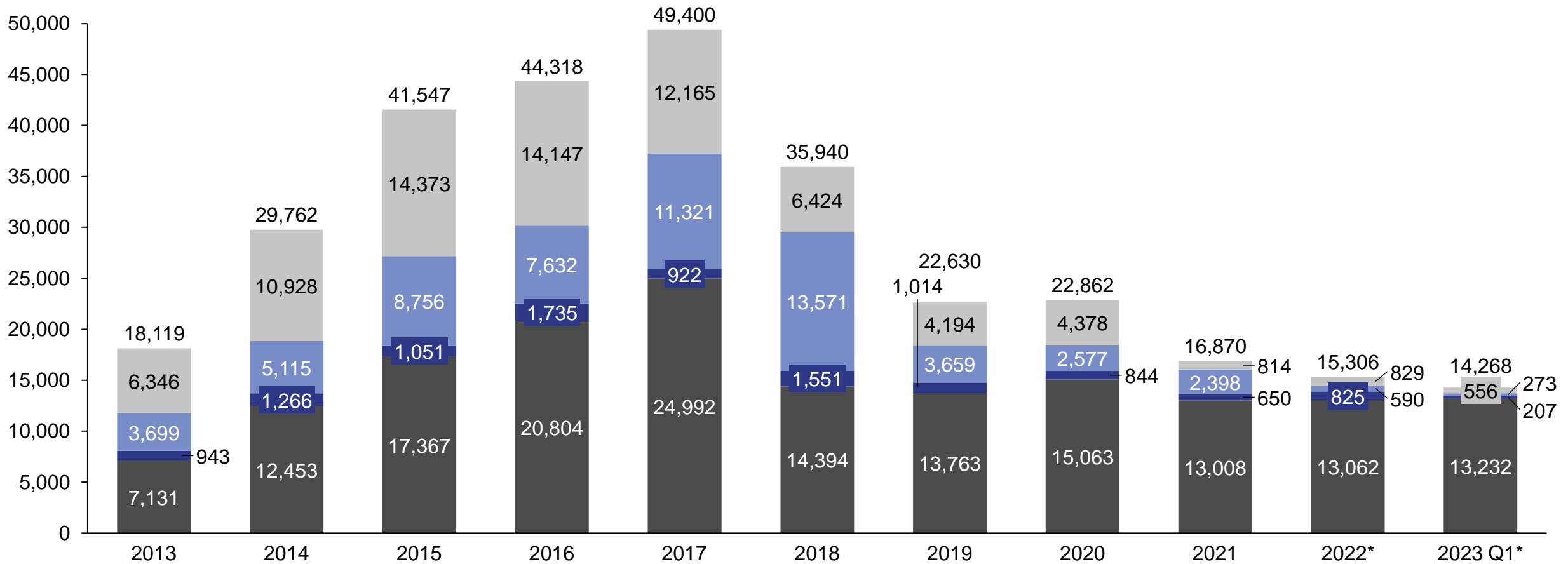


I-526 Petitions by Case Status

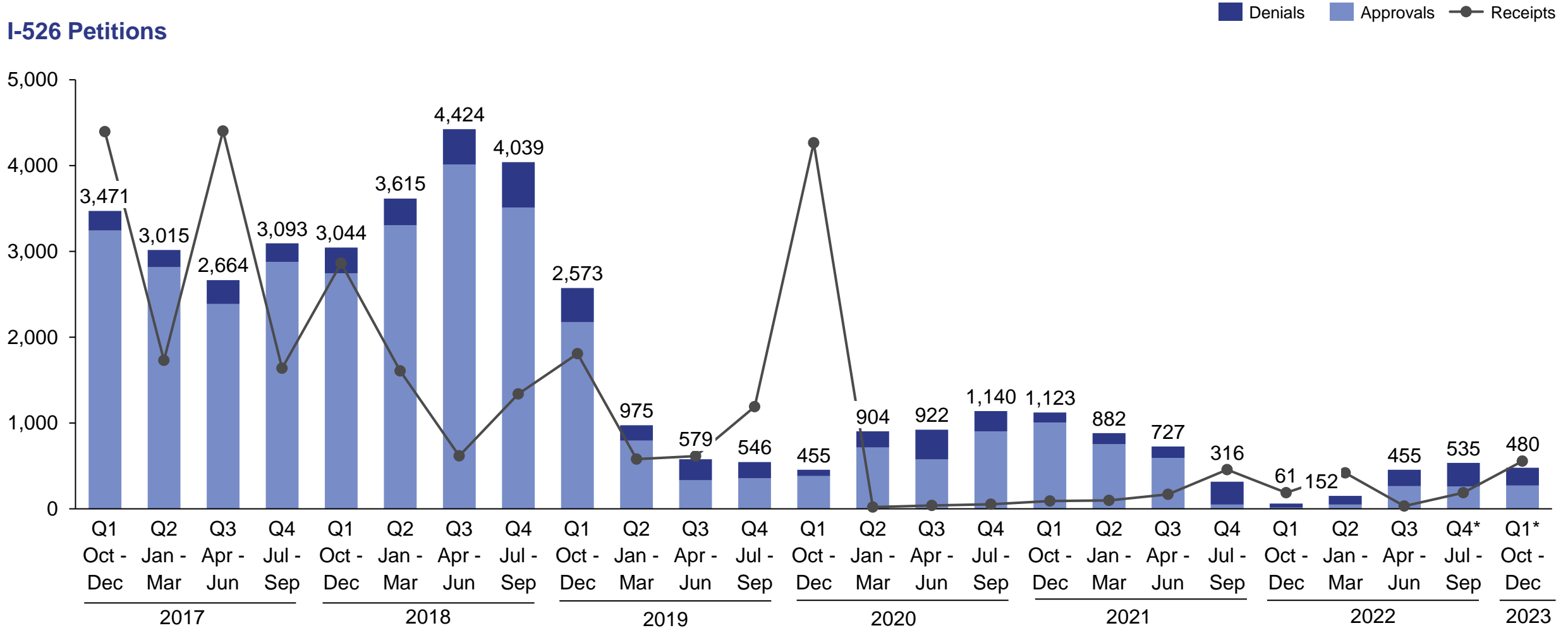

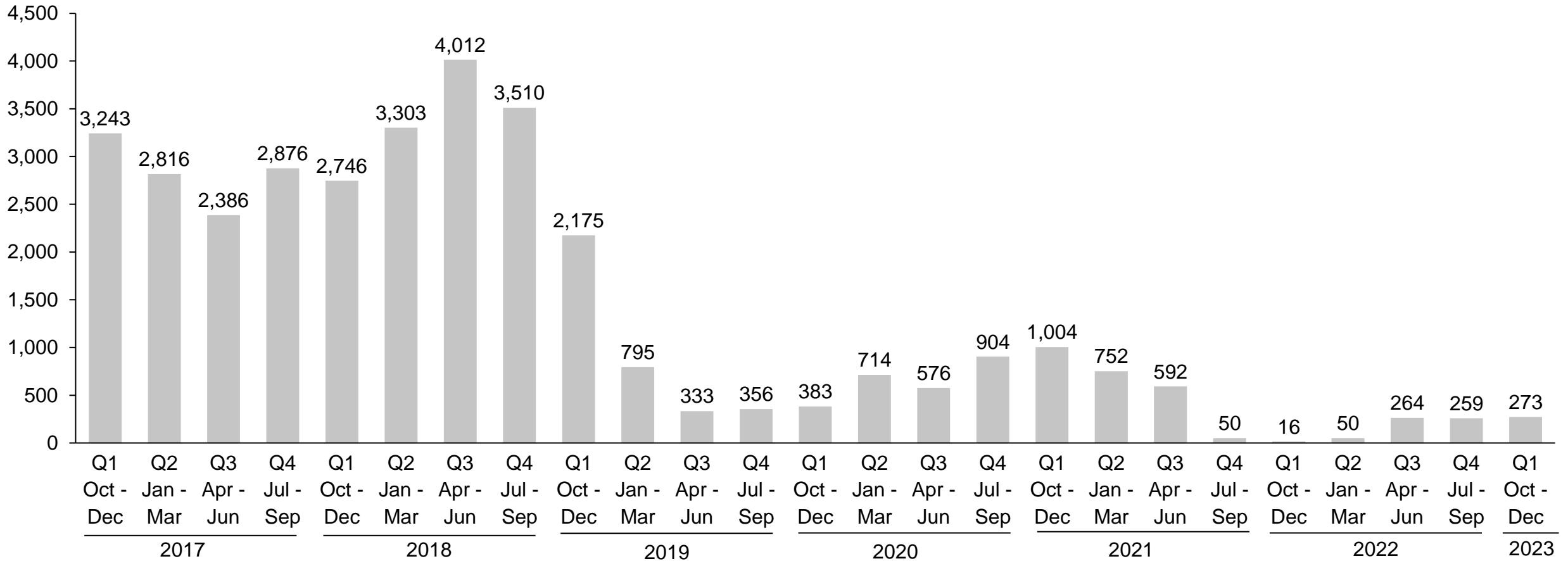

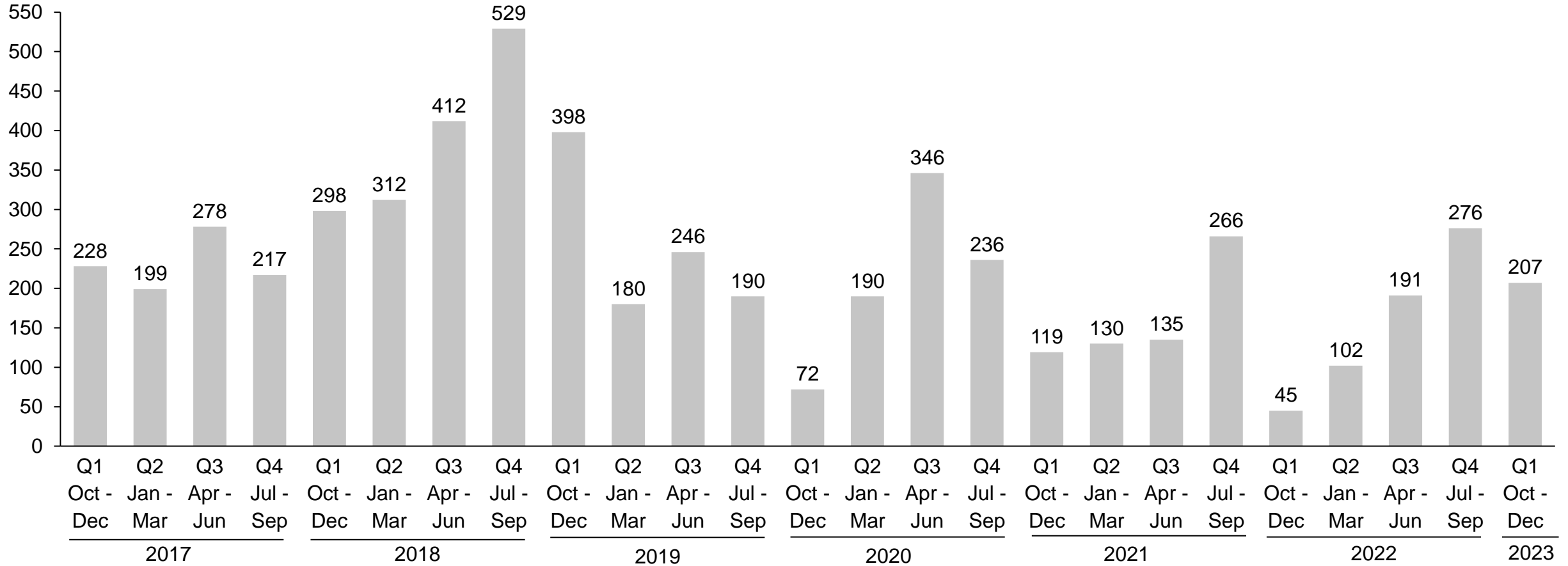

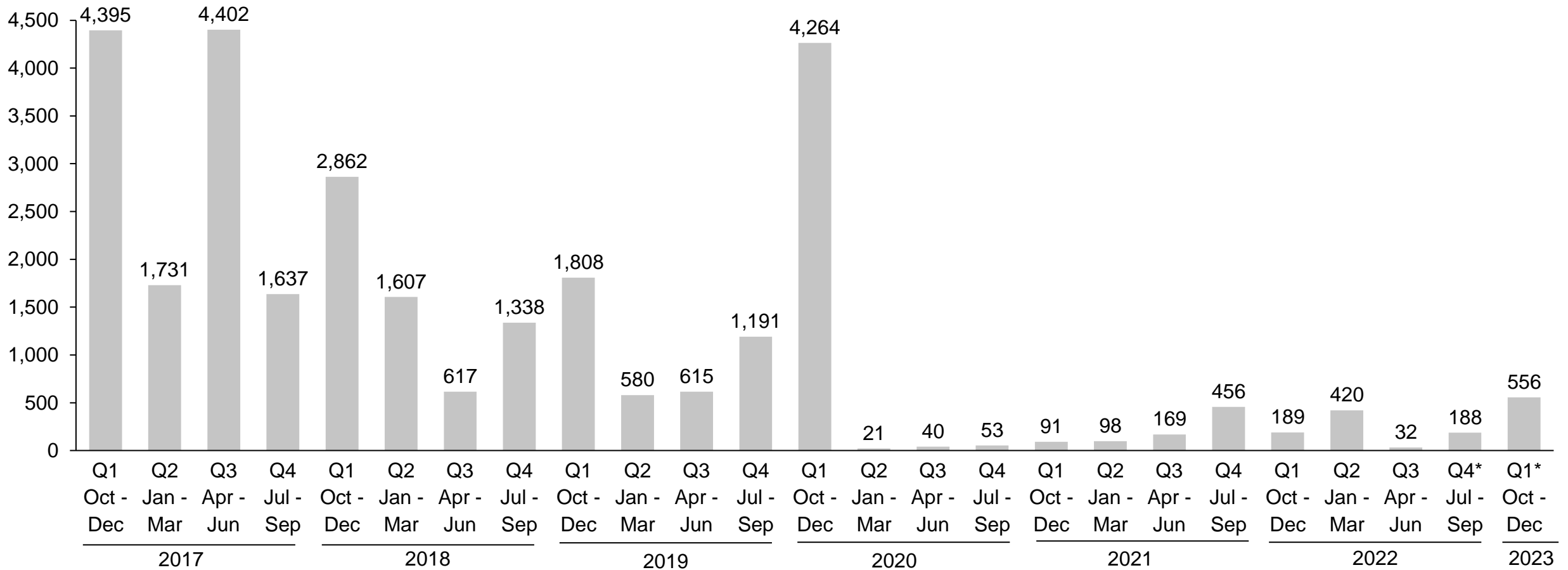

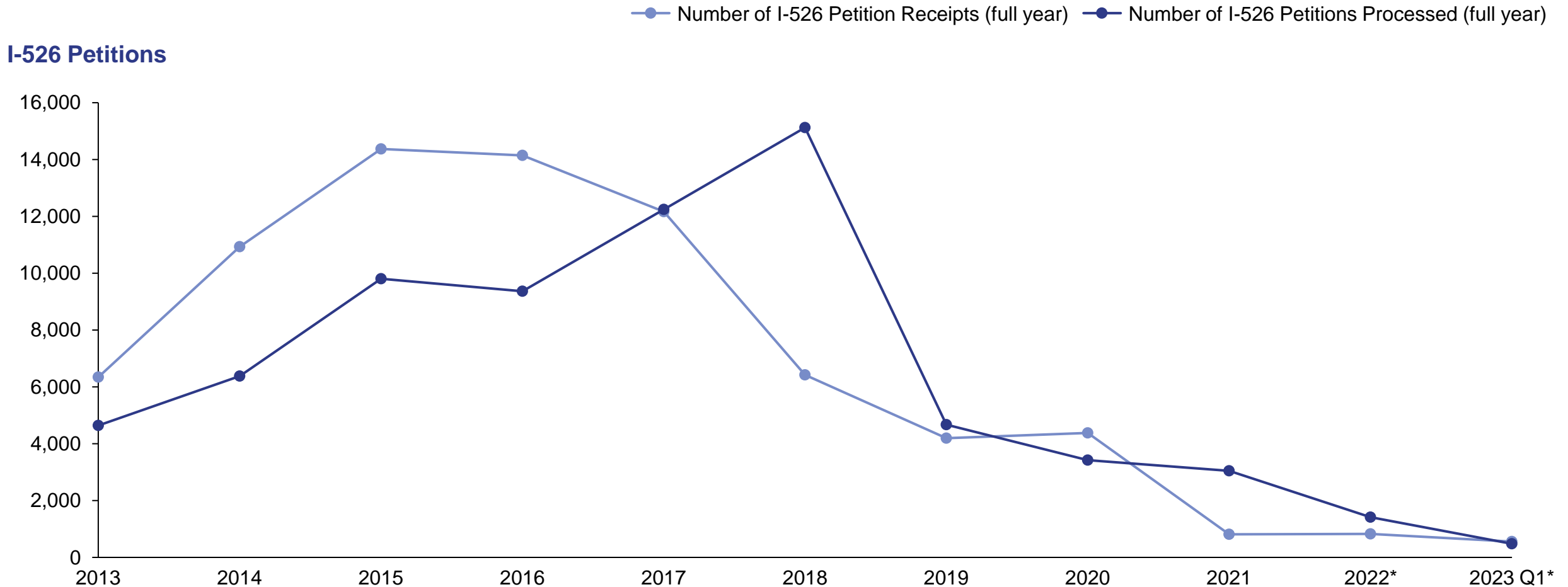

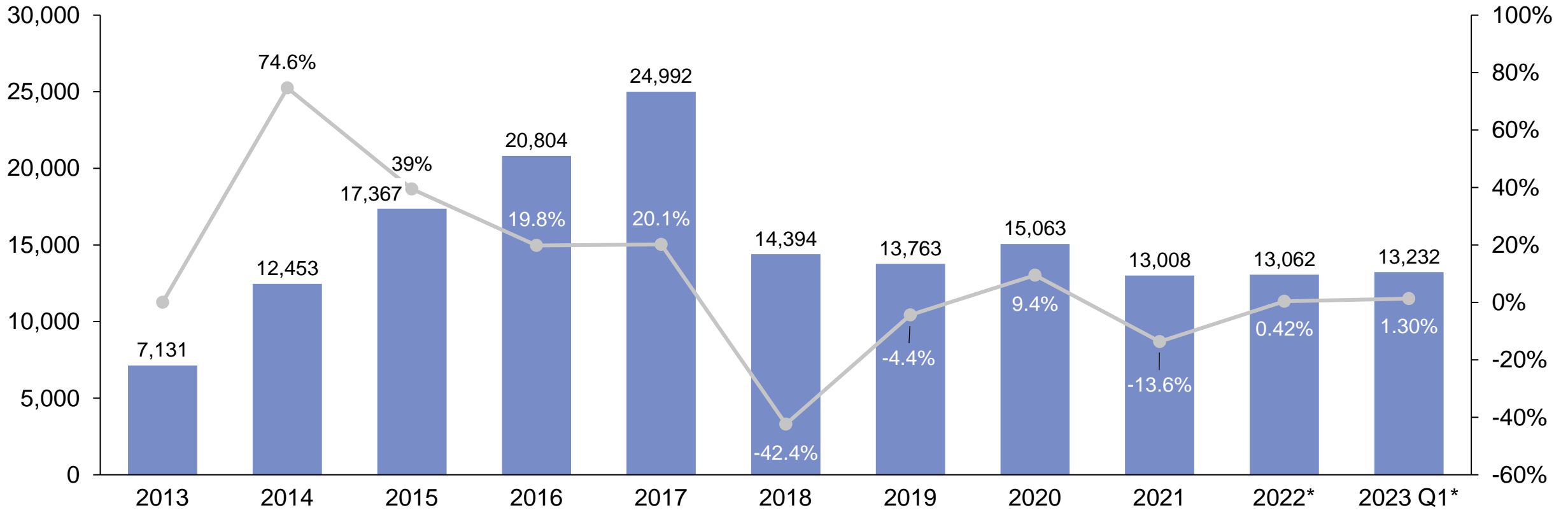
I-526 Petitions Pending and Year-Over-Year Backlog Growth

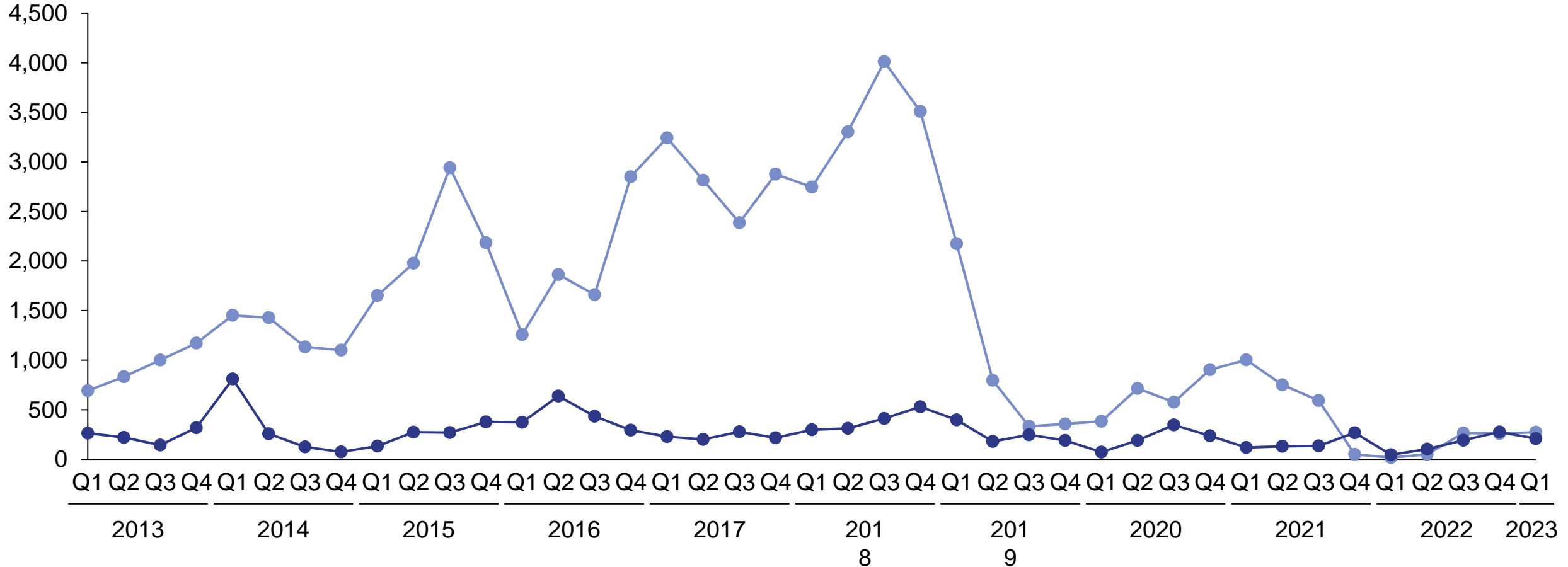

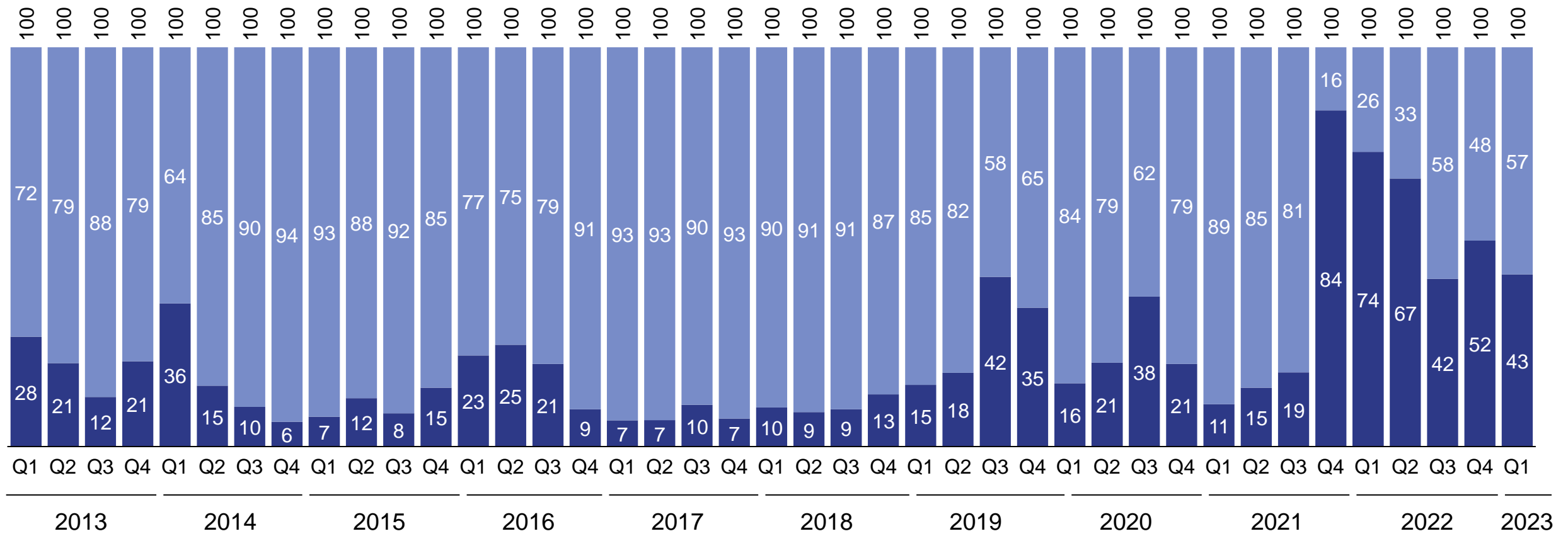


I-526 Petition Approval and Denial Rates

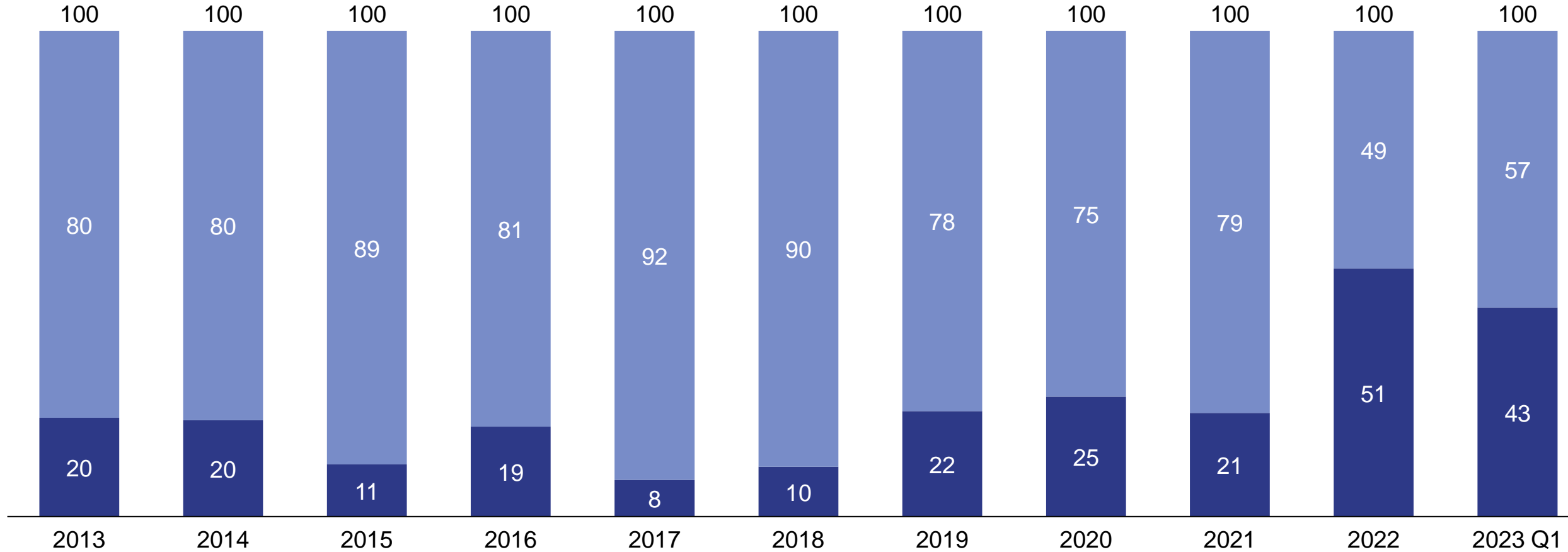

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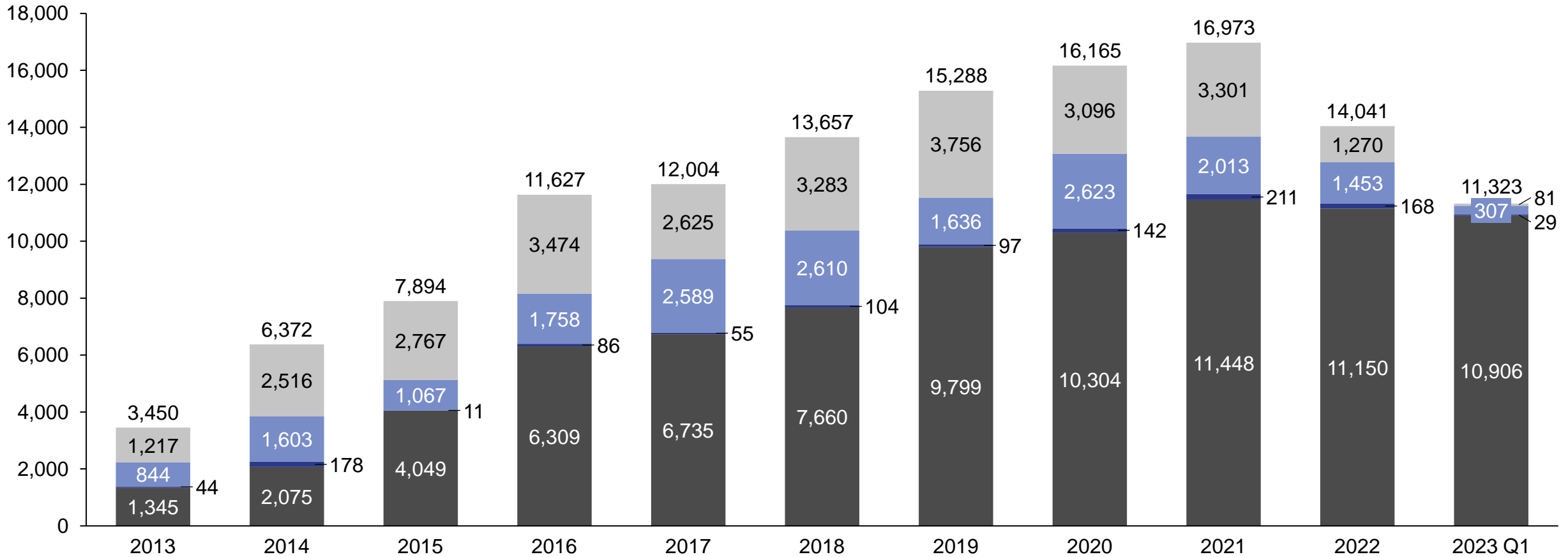


I-829 Petitions by Case Status

Receipts Approvals Denials Pending

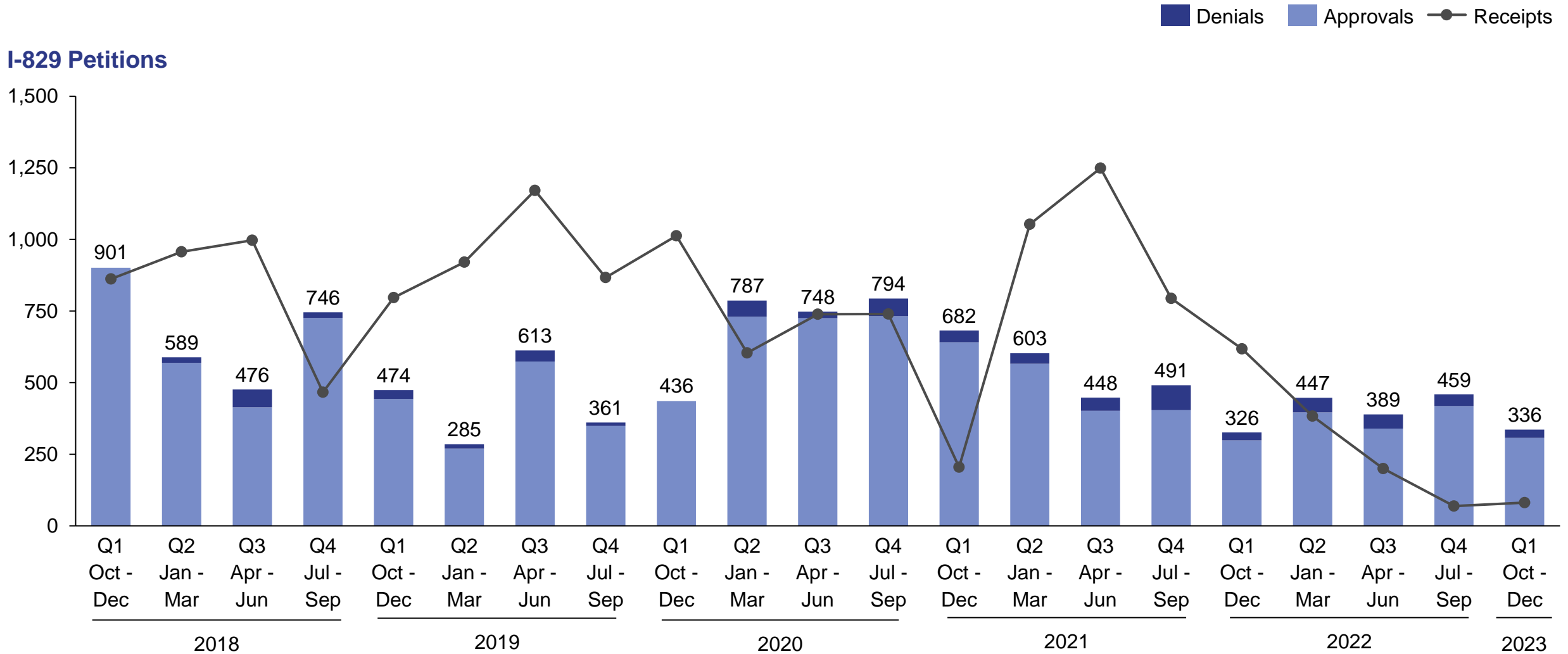

By quarter, FY2018-2023 Q1

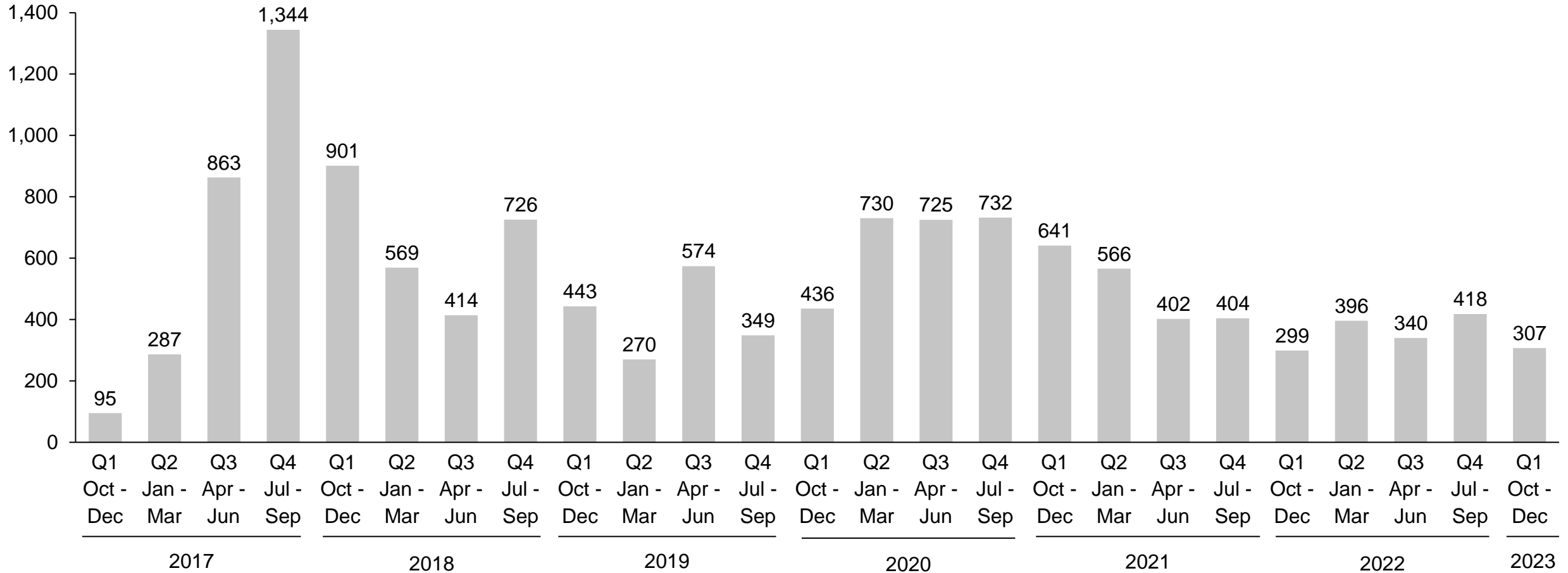

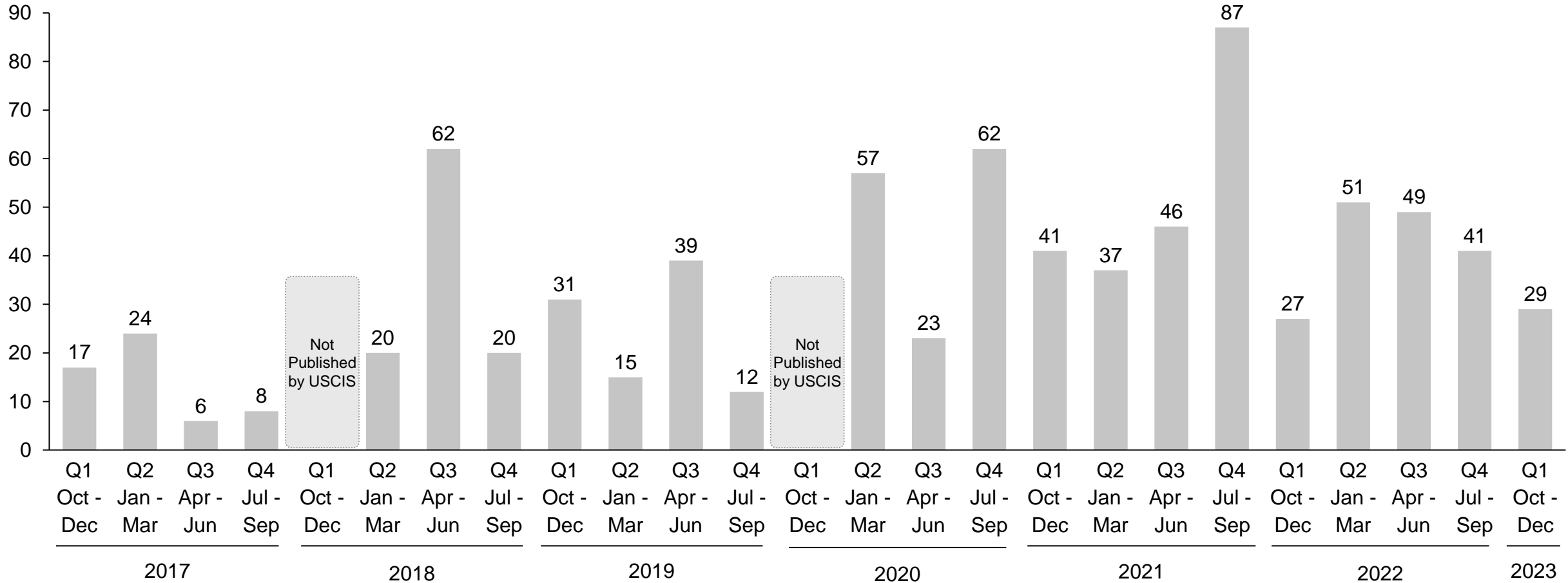

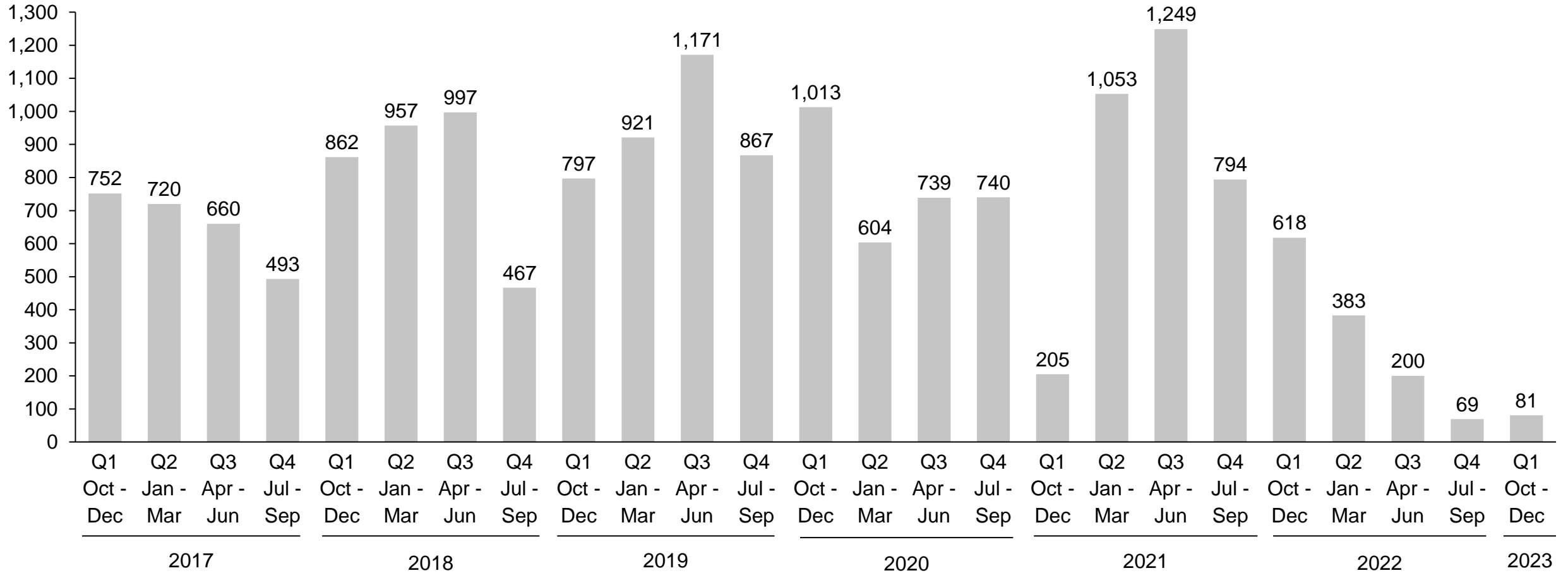

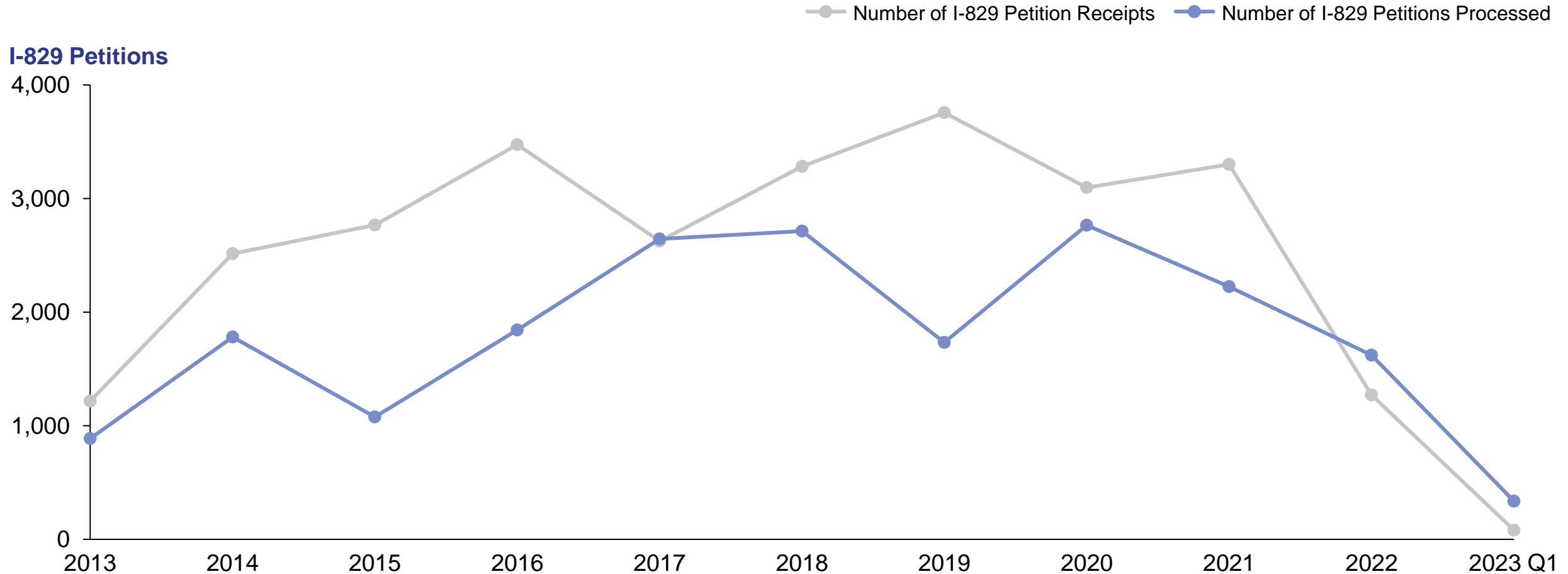

By fiscal year, FY2013-2023 Q1



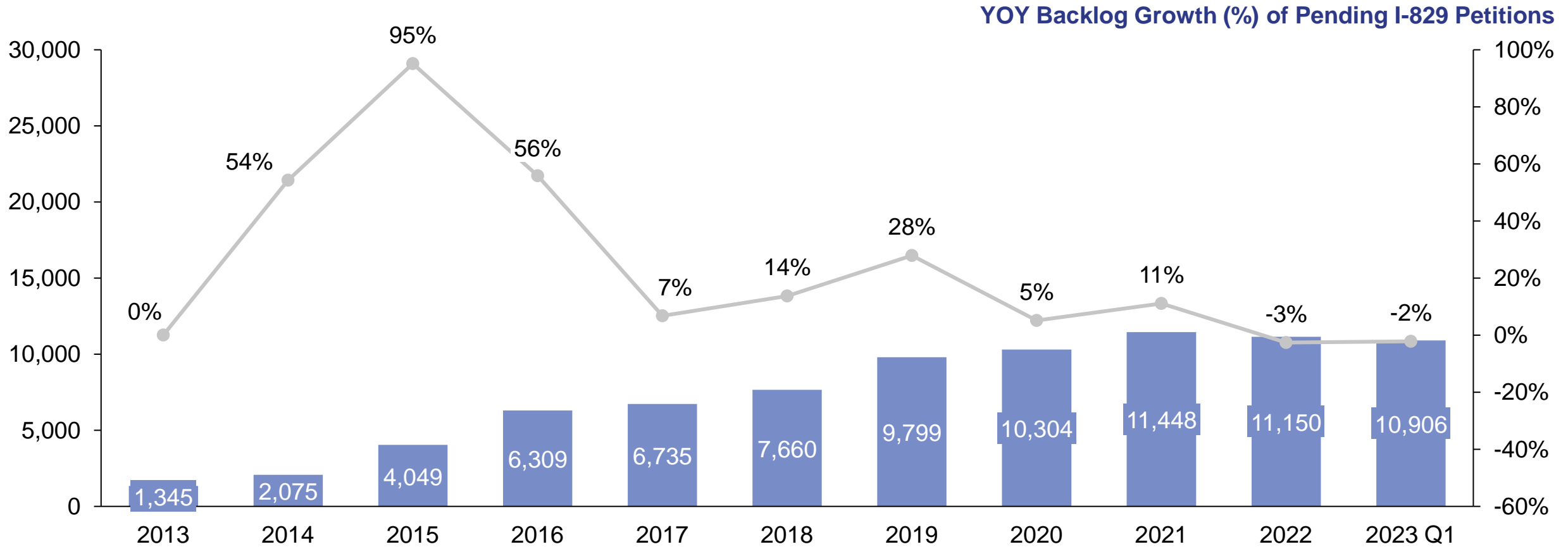

■ Number of I-829 Petitions Pending ● YOY Backlog Growth (%) of Pending I-829 Petitions

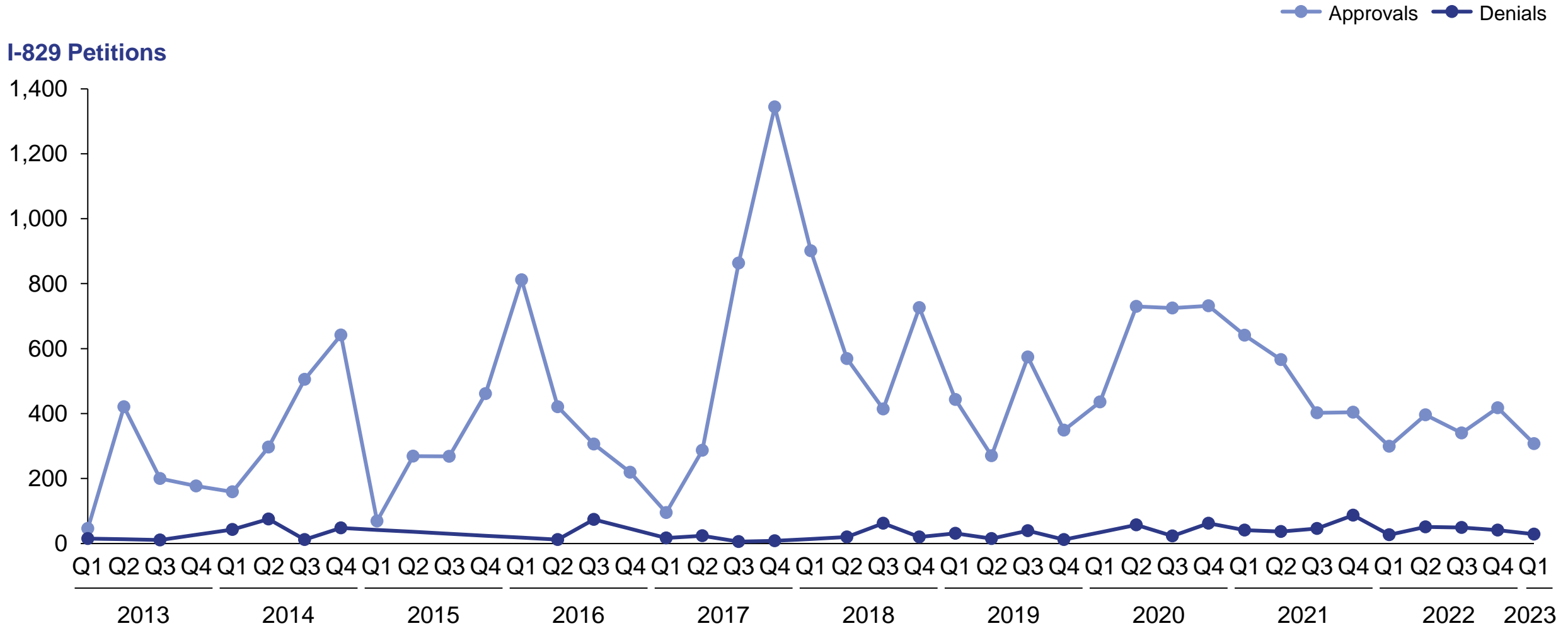

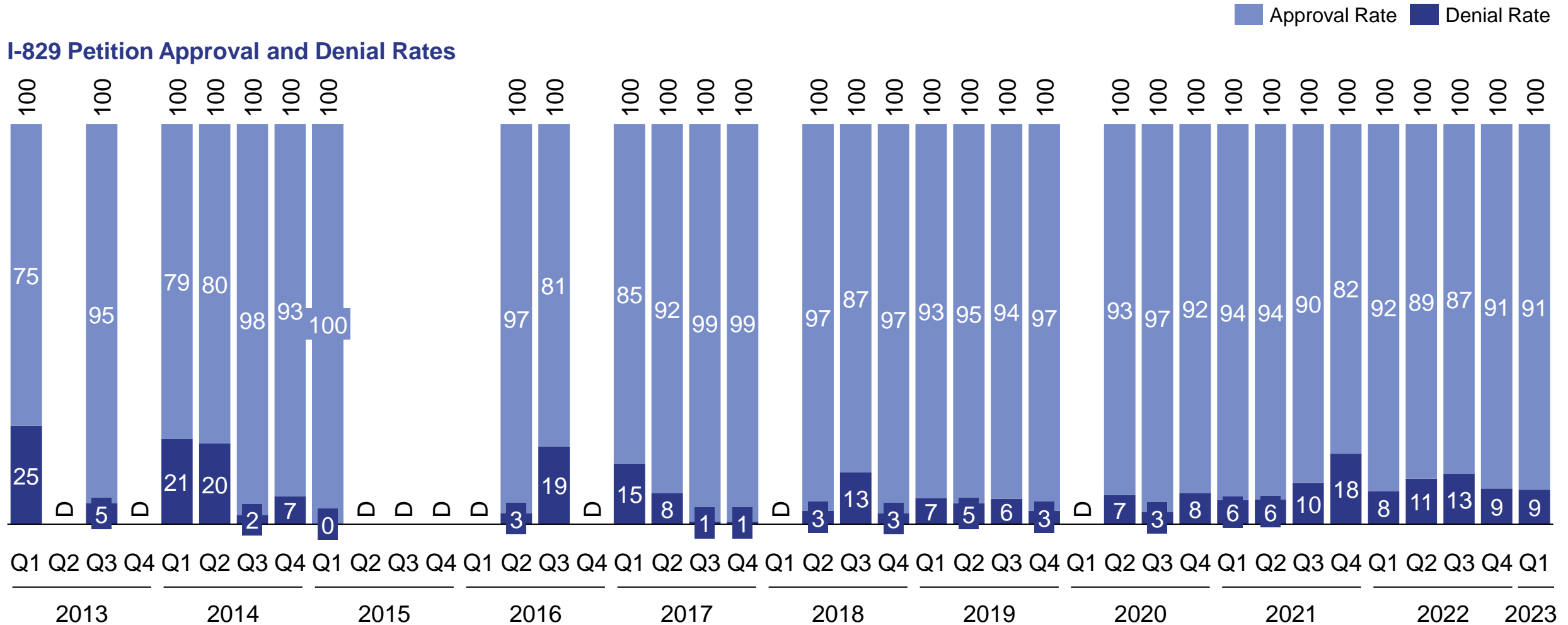

By quarter, FY2013-2023 Q1

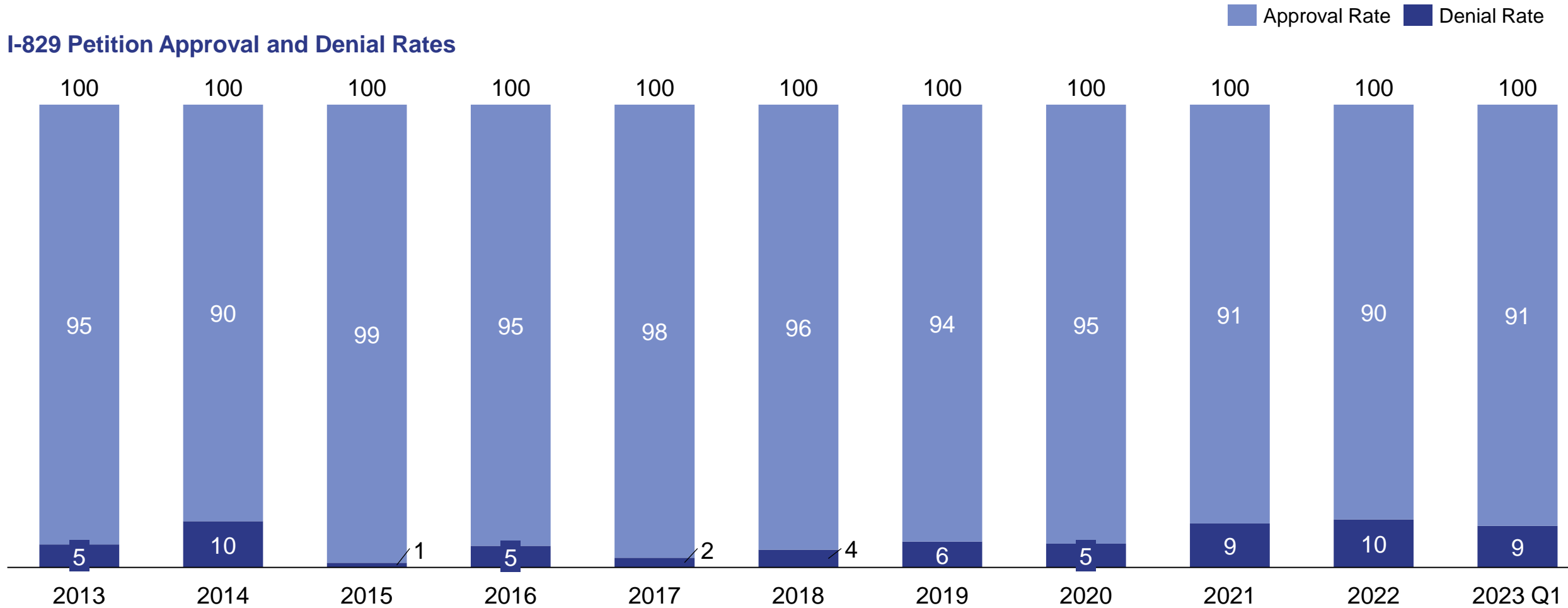

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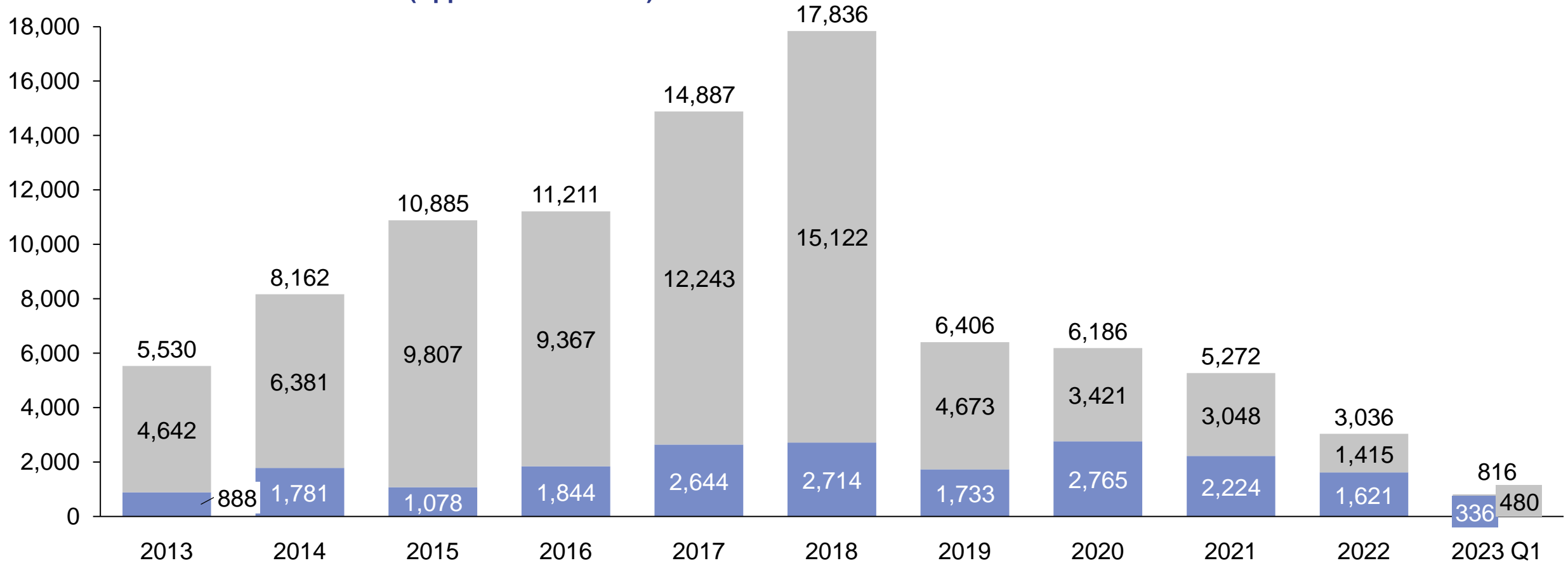

I-526 and I-829 Petitions Processed (Approvals & Denials)



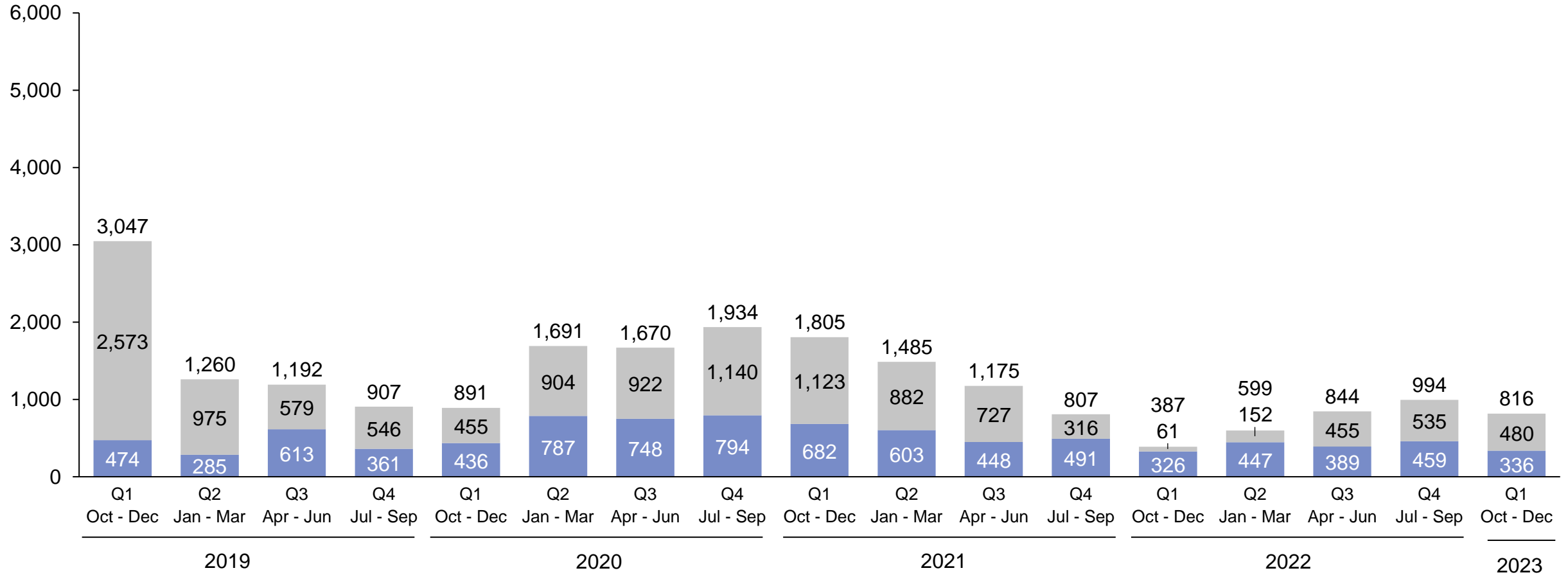

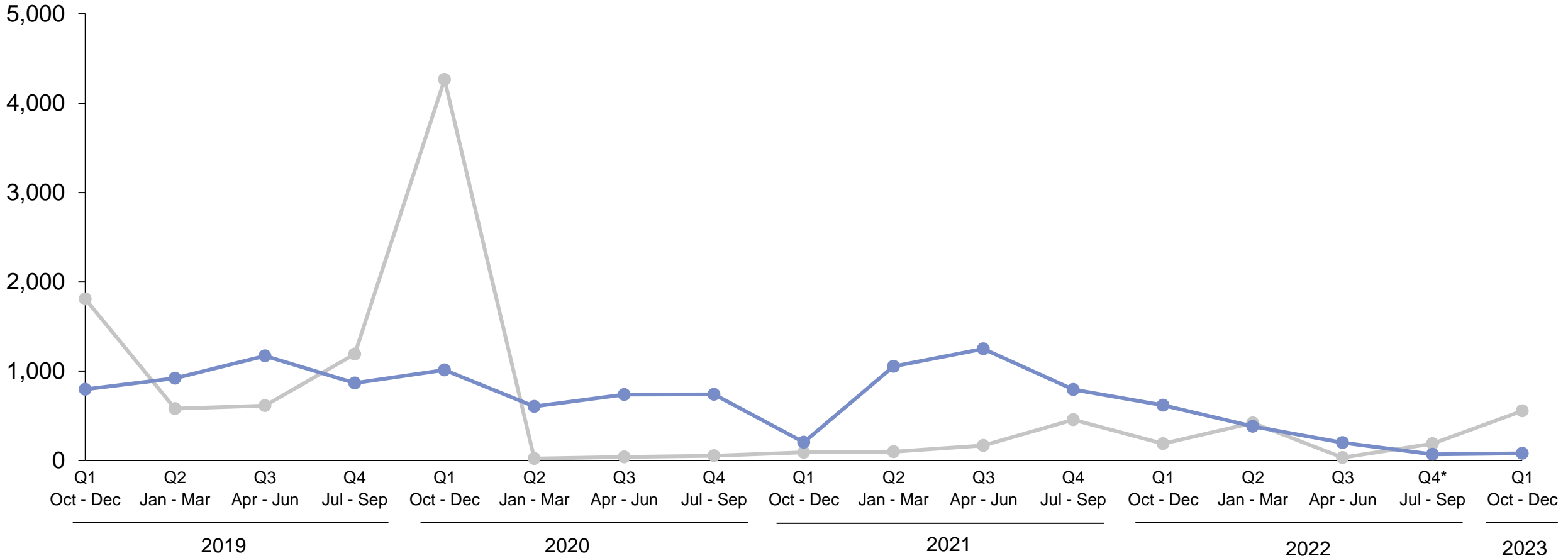

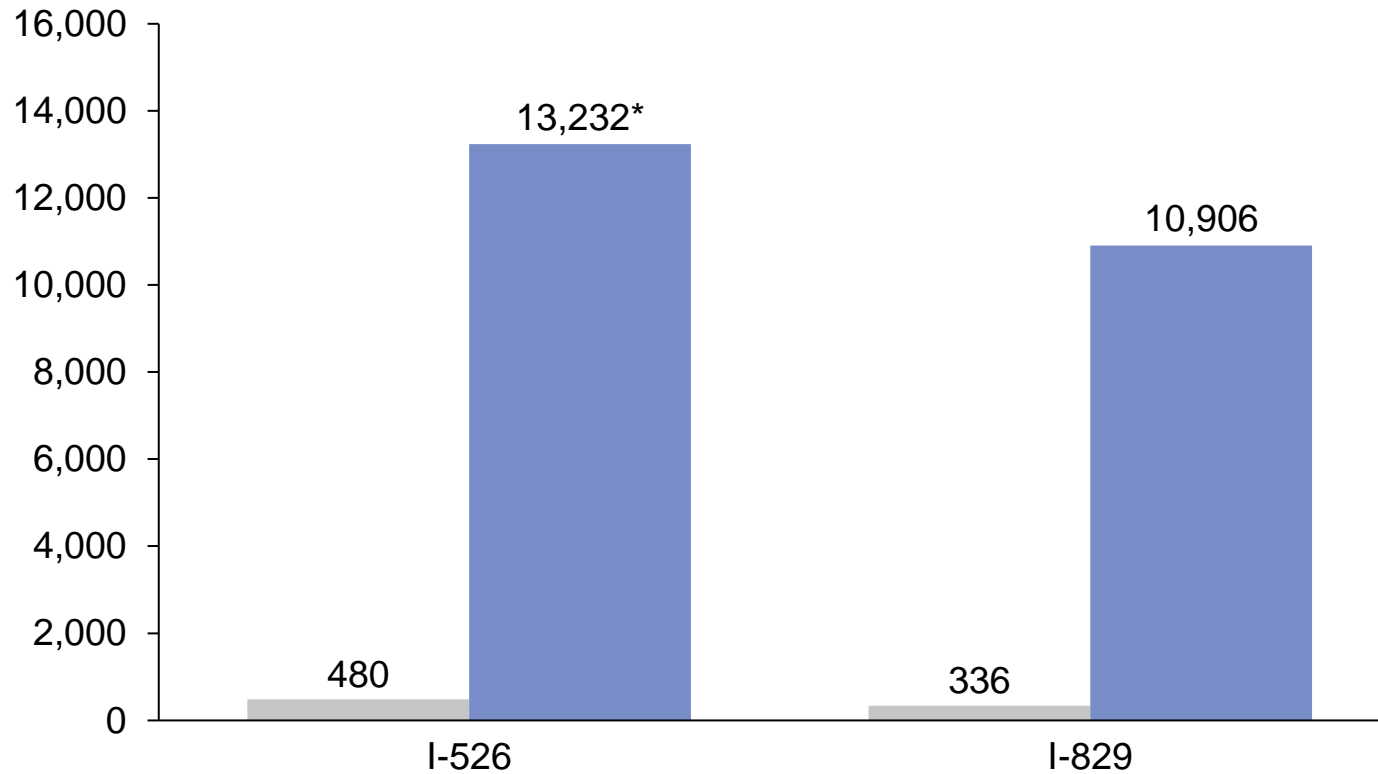

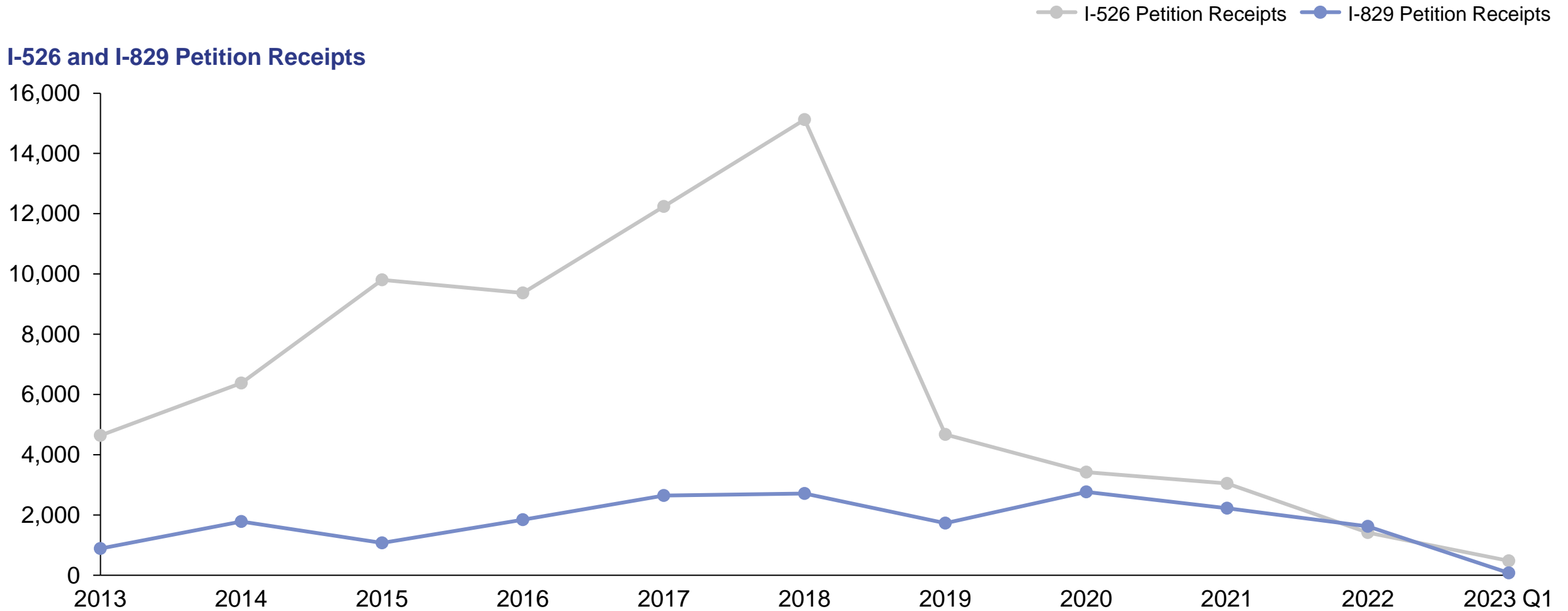

By fiscal year, FY2013-2023 Q1



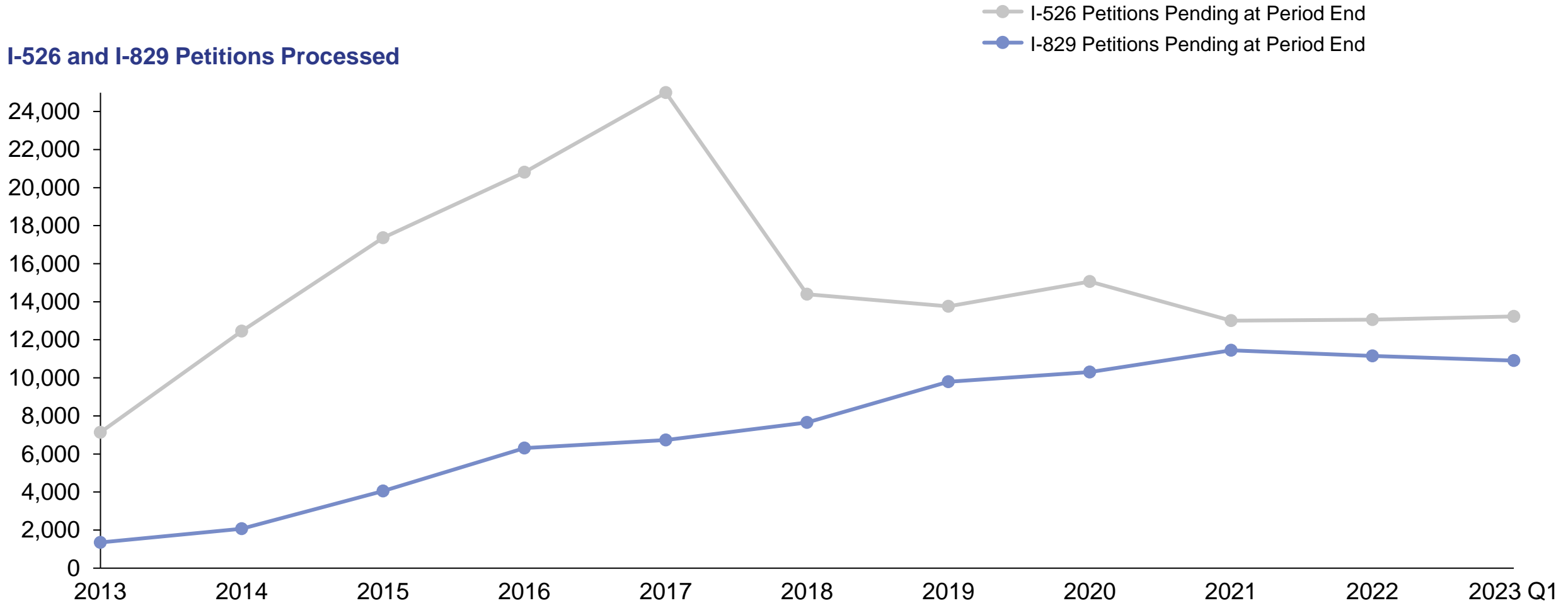
